About our Zoos

The state of Punjab has one Zoological park at Chhatbir, three small zoos one each at Ludhiana, Bathinda and Patiala, a deer park at Neelon and a bird aviary at Patiala. All the zoos and deer parks are holding wild animals and birds for education and recreation.

Mohindra Chaudhury Zoological Park, Chhatbir is one of the largest zoos in India. This zoo is spread over an area of 202 hectares and lies in the protected forest area of Chhatbir, once a hunting reserve of Maharaja of Patiala. The zoo aims to complement and strengthen the national efforts in the conservation of endangered and rare species of wild fauna through breeding under captive conditions, education and creating awareness in the society about need for conserving wildlife, biodiversity and natural resources. The zoo holds about 980 wild animals and birds belonging to about 85 different species.

Ludhiana zoo was started (1968-89) initially as a tiger safari and is spread over 15 hectares out of 85 hectare area of a reserved forest. The zoo has a tiger safari that attracts a number of visitors from nearby areas. Apart from tiger safari there are deer, bears, porcupines and emus on display in the zoo.

The Patiala Zoo, Patiala was established in 1968 within the Bir Mobbagh Wildlife Sanctuary. It is spread over an area of 14 hectares. It houses about 12 species of deer, primates, crocodiles and a variety of birds. The main species of deer are blackbucks, Sambars, spotted deer and barking deer.

The Deer Park Bir Talab, Bathinda is located in a notified protected forest about 8 km from the city of Bathinda. The zoo is spread over an area of 13 hectares. There are about 15 animal enclosures holding more than 200 animals.

The Deer Park Neelon is situated in rural area of Punjab on Ludhiana-Chandigarh Road at Neelon, District Ludhiana.

The park holds about 10 species of animals and birds. The main species are blackbucks, spotted deer, porcupines, parrots, budgerigars.

A new bird aviary having mainly exotic pheasants has been established at Baradari Gardens Patiala.

Why Adoption ?

The animal adoption scheme is a great way to show your support for wildlife conservation. By adopting your favourite animal, you contribute towards feeding of the animal for one full year / month and help support efforts in wildlife conservation.

Zoos are involved in captive breeding programs for endangered species and other conservation projects all of which need the support of concerned people like you or your institution.

Your adopting the animal will not only express your love for the animal but also inspire others to follow your footsteps. An adoption makes a great gift for birthdays, anniversaries etc. and is always something unique. Show your concern towards conservation.

How one can adopt an Animal ?

1. Select your favourite zoo.
2. Pick your favourite animal exhibited in the zoo as given overleaf.
3. Choose a level of support.
4. Fill in the attached form and hand it to the concerned zoo incharge.
5. You can also gift an adopted animal to your friends, parents, relatives or children.
6. In case your favourite animal is already adopted your name will be put in the waiting list, and as soon as the animal is available you will be informed.
